Traveling East on I-70 take exit 155 (Seventh St.). At the bottom of the exit follow signs for US 22 West. Follow 22 West for 4 miles and the club is on your right.

Traveling West on I-70 take exit 155 (Underwood St.). At the bottom of the exit continue straight through the traffic light for one block and turn left on Seventh St. Once on Seventh St., follow US 22 West for 4 miles and the club is on your right.

From the Athens area: Follow Rt. 13 north to Moore's Junction. Continue straight on Rt 93 to US 22 East (Maysville Pike). Follow US 22 for 1.5 miles and the club is on your left.

The fund, created by the family and friends of Bob Pitts, will be used to bring attention to the plight and address the issues of the underrepresented in Appalachian Ohio and to provide professional growth opportunities to employees of programs that serve disadvantaged citizens living in the 30-county area served by the Corporation for Ohio Appalachian Development's (COAD) and its member community action agencies, especially in the arenas of energy conservation and emerging green technologies.

For 30 of COAD's 35-year history, Bob Pitts, known as "Bubba" to his many friends and co-workers, was the heart and soul of the organization. Hired initially to operate COAD's Energy Office, he became the author and architect of many energy conservation programs statewide, including Warm-Choice, and helped draft the state's first weatherization standards. Known to many as a tireless advocate for the poor, Bob never hesitated to speak out about what made sense when it came to fair and equitable distribution of resources to low-income families who resided in the Appalachian foothills he so loved and cherished. Through his leadership, COAD leveraged and invested over \$188 million in energy conservation programs that weatherized over 72,000 low-income homes throughout Appalachian Ohio.

A native of Pike County, Ohio, Bob learned the value of community action through his previous work at the Community Action Committee of Pike County and the Jefferson County Community Action Council.
